- 1. Log into Handshake
- 2. From the homepage Click "Post a Job"
- 3. Job title: Use standard language for easy searches

Post your residency information session

- 1. Log into Handshake
- 2. From the homepage Click "Create an Event"
- 3. "Event name" use the following format:
 Organization Name- Info Session Pharmacy Residency *
- Ex. AB Pharmacy-Info Session-Pharmacy Residency
- 4. Choose location.
 Virtual sessions require your URL.

*Using this format will make it easier for students to search, and for the OPE to generate a link to send to students.

Students are sent a weekly email digest with announcements for their class. Each email will include a link to a Handshake with a reminder to look there for job information. We are happy to direct students to find you in Handshake but will no longer be forwarding emails and detailed listings.

Why the switch?

Having opportunities in a centralized location make it easier for all students to find opportunities and allows you to be in control of how it is shared.
