# Everyday disposal of medicine is SAFE, EASY, FREE and now available in Linn Co.

## ACCEPTED



- Prescription medicines, including controlled substances
- Over-the-counter medicines
- Vitamins and supplements
- Pet medicines

\*Medicines are accepted in the following forms:  
aerosols, blister packs, capsules, creams, gels,  
inhalers, liquids, patches, pills, powders

## NOT ACCEPTED



- Needles, sharps, or syringes
- Thermometers
- Bandages, glucose meters, medical tape or other medical supplies
- Empty pill bottles

Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into the disposal box. You are **NOT** required to remove the Rx labels from the bottles. All material collected will be incinerated.

## Prevent Youth from accessing and abusing prescription drugs

According to the Iowa Youth Survey, three out of five teens say that prescription drugs are easy to access in their parents' medicine cabinet.



## Prevent medication from getting into our water

The CDC reports that pharmaceuticals, including prescription drugs, are present in our nation's water and may cause environmental harm.



## Prevent accidental and intentional poisonings

According to the CDC, nearly 9 out of 10 poisoning deaths are caused by drugs.
